

PICNIC IS MARK WADE MARK WADE IS A **REAL VEN-**TRILOQUIST. HE CAN **MAKE PUPPETS** TALK. HE CAN TEACH AND MAKE YOU LAUGH TOO. IN HIS SCHOOL SHOWS, HE PLAYS THE DUAL ROLE **OF** ENTERTAINER **AND** EDUCATOR. HE HAS LEARNED AND HE PRACTICES THE ART OF TEACHING CHILDREN THROUGH THE

One of the most common overlooked features in puppetry is audience participation. Many of the art forms used in puppetry blend, wander, or fall over into each other. All to often we fail to use the simple close at hand objects plus our creativity and the audience in our shows. After doing many shows we think we are in the groove when really we are in a rut. Why not try another approach. A new style.

MOP AND BROOM PUPPETRY

We have all seen the giant puppets that are in some shows. Why not invorporate this idea into a show. It is inexpensive and easy to produce. Simply put, tie or screw a 18" to 24" wooden dowel just above the broom or mop head to fit a shirt or t-shirt around it. Tie the mop into any hairdo that you might need. A mop can be draped on top of a

broom head. In a box you willl have felt pieces for ears, eyes, nose, and mouths. You could use a neck tie, drape cloth for more customs. Any story can be presented by these mop puppets. Think of the advantages.

1. The cost for an entire show is low

1. The cost for an entire show is low, 2. The puppets are light weight. Children can operate them, 3. No strings, no rods, no stage, no lights unless you want them for special effects.4. The audience (children or adults) create their own figures by attaching the face parts and clothes. (Each one is told what their character is.),5. No one will need to read or memorize their parts because you have a reader read the story with great expression into a mike.,6. The entire audience is envolved because they will make all of the sound effects when directed by cue cards.7.No backdrops several audience members hold up signs (can be
