Minutes from Sept. 20 Meeting at Richard's Marionette Barn.

Janice told about our performance of Fractured Fairy Tales at the Ohio State Fair on August 1 and at the Riverside Children's Center on August 11. Janice, Matthew, Justin and Jesus performed for these shows. It was especially fun at the Riverside Children's Center as the kids really sounded like they were enjoying the performance.

Matthew proposed that the monies the guild received from the Riverside Children's Center go toward supplies for the puppet-making workshop that Janice will be doing for the October and November guild meetings. Janice agreed. Nobody disagreed so idea passed.

The plan is for everyone attending both the October AND November meetings to make and take a puppet. There may be a cost of up to \$15 per puppet for materials. Janice will be acquiring the materials and sewing bodies in preparation for these workshops.
